Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The stormy winter is nearly past. The warm spring is at the door. Greetings from the Christian Witness Center at Warsaw, Missouri. May the blessing of the Lord warm your whole family!

### **Evangelism Emphasis Month and [Gospel Camp](#)**

“But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were distressed and scattered, as sheep not having a shepherd.” (Matthew 9:36)

When Jesus saw so many people, He had compassion for their lost souls. Jesus felt sorrow because they were just like sheep without a shepherd. They were distressed and scattered, hungry and in danger. As thousands of young Chinese students flood into all the campuses in the Midwest, do we have the same eyes as Jesus and see their spiritual needs? Do we have the same heart as Jesus and give our compassion on them?

Coworkers from separate campuses have told me that they have been ministering to their undergraduate students for a half year, but only a few students have turned to Christ. The students' backgrounds hinder them from accepting Jesus Christ. Please continue inviting them to attend this upcoming [Gospel Camp](#) during spring break. Some of those nonbelievers' hearts may have been softened by those campus coworkers' hard labor. Maybe these nonbelievers are very close to salvation now. Your small step, just an invitation, just an encouragement, may help turn hearts to Jesus. After this spring semester, some students will return to China or other places for summer vacation in China. If they have accepted Christ, they can carry the gospel to their families. If they have not accepted Christ, students may face resistance from non-believing families and friends. These students may turn away from God. It is important to help them become children of God now, before they leave. The Gospel Camp at the Christian Witness Center is a great opportunity to reach

these people for Christ, before they return home for a visit, or before they graduate and take a job.

This year, the Gospel Camp will be held from the evening of Friday March 12 to noon Monday March 15. Rev. Yujian Hong and Rev. Daniel Chan will be our speakers. The Chinese Church in Christ—South Valley at San Jose, CA, the Boulder Baptist Church in Colorado, and the Los Angeles First Evangelical Church Association will send their short-term mission teams to assist the Gospel Camp.

In the last few newsletters, we shared that a successful student ministry moves fast. Our goal is to win the hearts of students to Christ within about half a year after they arrive here. Then they will have about a year to grow as disciples of Christ. They may start learning to serve on the campus. We know that God brings the speakers and the mission teams here to reach out lost souls. Please pray that the Great Commission can be fulfilled. Pray that more brothers and sisters will have the compassionate eyes and heart of Jesus. Pray that they come and also invite more nonbelievers to come to the Camp, so that more may be saved.

### **Experience the Bible through the [Holy Land Study Trip](#)**

“Now all these things happened to them for examples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.” (1 Corinthians 10:11)

Paul told us that the journey of the Israelites is our daily example. The Israelites followed the Lord by the pillar of a cloud and by the pillar of fire in the wilderness. Seeing their journey will improve our daily walk with God. [The Holy Land Study Trip](#) brings us to this history and brings history back with us. The trip is from June 14 to 25. We will start from Cairo, cruise on the River Nile, visit the Pyramids, the Sphinx and the Egyptian Historical Museum. From Cairo, we will follow the Israelites' exodus route, pass under the water of the Red Sea, follow along the footprints of Moses toward Mount Sinai. After climbing Mount Sinai, we will pass the Red Sea, and see the great wilderness of Kadesh-barnea from the sea. After entering into Jordan, we will travel through the lands of Edom, Moab and Amman. There we will visit Petra, Amman, and Jeresh. From Mount Nebo, we will see the whole Jordan Valley. Then we will pass through the Jordan River valley to Jericho, Massada, Qumran, En Gedi, and the Dead Sea. Then we will go up to Jerusalem to walk where Jesus walked, from His birthplace in Bethlehem to Calvary where He was crucified and buried. Then, we will continue north to the Sea of Galilee and surrounding cities, the Mount of Beatitudes, Capernaum, Cana, and Nazareth to remember His ministry and His teaching. Onward, we will go to Megiddo, Mount Carmel, Caesarea, and other historic sites. It will be a great trip to increase our remembrance and our love to Him and knowing how to following Him. Our roster is two-thirds full now. The land fee is fixed, but the airfare changes each week, usually upward. Please make your decision now and apply. In the coming few weeks, Brother Dale will prepare the facility for the upcoming Gospel Camp. Please pray for him and his family.
